

Checking Out Library eBooks for Kindle

1. Visit Alliance Digital Media Library through www.kewaneelibrary.org or at <http://alliance.lib.overdrive.com>.
2. Login to Alliance Digital Media Library by selecting the library which issued your library card and entering your card number (with D, no spaces) and PIN. Call the library at (309) 852-4505 if you do not know your PIN.
3. Browse and check out a Kindle book.
4. Click *Get for Kindle* to open Amazon.com. Sign in with your Amazon account if you're not logged in.
5. At the *Deliver to* drop-down option, select a Kindle device or Kindle reading app. Click *Get library book* and sync your device or app to download the book.

If you do not have an active Wi-Fi connection, choose *Transfer via Computer*, and then select the device which will receive the USB transfer. Read below for more information about transferring content via USB.

Wireless Delivery of Library eBooks

An active Wi-Fi connection is required for wireless delivery of library Kindle eBooks to a Kindle device. (You may not use your Kindle's 3G connection.) If your Kindle is not Wi-Fi capable or you do not have an active Wi-Fi connection, use Amazon's instructions to transfer files via USB.

To connect to a Wi-Fi network using your Kindle:

1. Press *Home*, then press *Menu*.
2. Use the 5-way controller to select *Settings*.
3. Select *View* next to *Wi-Fi Settings* to display a list of detected Wi-Fi networks. You may have to wait a moment as your Kindle detects networks in range.
4. Choose *connect* next to the Wi-Fi network to which you want to connect. If necessary, enter the Wi-Fi network password. Use *SYM* to enter any numbers or symbols in your password and *Shift* (↑) for uppercase characters.

After you have connected to a Wi-Fi network once, your Kindle will automatically connect to it again when it detects its signal.

Transferring Kindle Content Via USB

1. On Amazon.com, open the *Manage Your Kindle* page to get to *Your Kindle Library*. To the right of the book title you want to transfer to your Kindle, click *Actions*. Choose *Download & Transfer Via USB*.
2. You may be prompted to open or save the file; choose *Save* and select a location that's easy to find, e.g. Desktop.
3. Once the file has been saved, connect your Kindle to your computer using the USB cable. When connected to your computer, your Kindle will go into USB drive mode, and you won't be able to use the device. Your wireless service is temporarily shut off, and you will not receive any of your subscriptions while in this mode.
4. Your Kindle will appear in the same location as external USB drives usually appear. For Windows users, this is typically in the *Computer* or *My Computer* menu. For Mac users, the drive will appear on the desktop.
5. Open the Kindle drive. You will see several folders inside, one of which will be named *documents*. This is the folder to which you will move your downloaded Kindle content.
6. Locate your downloaded file, and drag and drop it into the correct file.
7. Safely eject your Kindle from your computer, then unplug the USB cable. The file you transferred will now appear on your Kindle Home screen.

Returning Books Early

1. On Amazon.com, open the *Manage Your Kindle* page to get to *Your Kindle Library*. To the right of the book title you want to transfer to your Kindle, click *Actions*. Choose *Return This Book*.
2. When it asks you if you are sure, click *Yes*. You will no longer be able to access the title on your Kindle.

You still will see the library eBook book title listed in *Your Kindle Library*, but you will not be able to access the library eBook. You must click *Actions* and choose *Delete From Library* if you wish to remove the title from *Your Kindle Library*.

The library also continues to offer eBooks and downloadable audiobooks for use on PC and Mac computers, mobile devices such as smartphones and tablets, audio players, and eBook readers like the Barnes & Noble® Nook™ and Sony® Reader. KPLD offers downloadable book service through Alliance Digital Media Library (ADML), a consortium of more than 60 public libraries in central Illinois. ADML is coordinated by Reaching Across Illinois Library System, a multi-type regional library system, and is a contracted service with OverDrive, Inc., a provider of digital media content.

Kindle users can browse Alliance Digital Media Library's collection of bestselling and classic eBooks from a PC or Mac computer, check out titles using a library card, and select "Get for Kindle" to deliver eBooks to their Kindle device or any device running the free Kindle app. Users who enjoy eBooks on Kindle will benefit from Amazon's Whispersync technology that synchronizes notes, highlights, and last page read between their Kindle and free Kindle apps.

The library is anticipating an increased demand for its eBook collection. It encourages patrons to join waiting lists for titles currently checked out and to take advantage of the Always Available eBooks. Alliance Digital Media Library continues to build its eBook collection and advises patrons to check back often for additional titles.
